2. Adults must attend full camp or have a replacement – or take children home.

FOOD AND DRINK

Health regulations require that no gum, food or drink be allowed in the pool area or tabernacle. Cans, cups, candy wrappers, etc., must not be carried into mountain area. Water for drink is the exception.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

Each camp will have made preparations for accidents, fire and tornadoes.

BELL

The bell is used for emergency, call to worship, class change, etc. It is to be rung only by persons authorized by Camp Director.

PARKING

Insurance/Fire protection requires all vehicles (except emergency and service vehicles) to be parked in designated parking areas.

CONCERNING TELEPHONE CALLS

Any long distance calls made during the camp this week must be collect calls or the camper will be responsible to pay for it. No phone Calls may be charged to the Association or to the Assembly.

CONCESSION STAND

Concession stand profits will be used for expenses of Camp.

CHURCH BRINGS ONE CHECK FOR TOTAL DUE TO CAMP JUNE 18, 2018

- 1. PRE-REGISTRATION FORM: Due in CKBA Office June 11, 2018. (Campers need to be pre-registered to be insured). NO PRE-REGISTRATION FEE - TOTAL AMOUNT DUE JUNE 18, 2018 (FIRST DAY OF CAMP).
2. CABIN ASSIGNMENTS: Assignments will be made by Camp Director - with one adult sponsor to each 10 children.
3. There will be a Nurse on grounds at all times - Medical Doctor on call.
4. Each camper must attend all planned activities (except when ill and then on nurse's orders) including both worship services and classes.
5. Each camper is expected to conduct himself in a Christlike manner at all times.

OTHER REMINDERS

- 1. No refunds for early departure.
2. Each church responsible for own transportation to and from camp.
3. Any camper will be returned home if conduct necessitates such action.
4. All groups must be properly sponsored: 1 man per 10 boys, 1 lady per 10 girls. Sponsors MUST be a high school graduate or older.
5. Jeans are required for mountain climbing.

NOT ALLOWED

- 1. Alcoholic beverages or tobacco
2. Fireworks
3. Camp fires without Resident Manager's approval
4. Mountain climbing except daylight with sponsor
5. Throwing rocks or any items
6. Defacing property, rocks, etc.
7. Smoking
8. Profanity
9. Water fights or fighting
10. Leaving camp without approval of Camp Director & Sponsor
11. No hats in the Tabernacle or cafeteria

DRESS CODE

While on the Southwest Baptist Churches Assembly grounds campers may not wear apparel that exposes the midriff, is extremely tight fitting, or has writing on the back of pants or shorts. Apparel may not display or promote tobacco, alcohol, controlled substances or inappropriate language or pictures. All shorts and dresses should be modest length. At SWBCA, modest shorts are generally defined as shorts that have at least a five inch inseam or longer and dresses and skirts should be four inches from the top of the knee or longer. Slits in dresses or skirts should also be modest length. Shirts/tops must have at least three inches across the shoulder. Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times outside cabins, except while swimming.
